#### Presentation

- Speaker: Zachary Hordeski, PG; Hydrogeologist Endeavor Professional Services
- Bio: Graduated from Penn State with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Geoscience in 2017. Started his career with 6 years of hands-on field work as the lead geophysicist at Earth Data Northeast, where he participated in hundreds of hydrogeologic investigations and environmental projects. Through this job he gained extensive experience performing borehole geophysics and downhole video surveys. Over 6 years, he logged over 500 boreholes, across a variety of geologic environments. At the earliest opportunity, he acquired his Pennsylvania PG license and began administering geologic consulting as a professional geologist. In 2023, he was recruited to work for Endeavor Professional Services as a hydrogeologist. Shortly after joining Endeavor, he started his own borehole geophysical logging service to support water supply and environmental projects across Pennsylvania. He now seeks to expand this service to the mining industry.

# PENNSYLVANIA MINING PROFESSIONALS (PMP) December 11, 2024 MEETING MINUTES

### Business Meeting Summary (10:13 AM - 10:20 AM)

PMP President Jordan Rodgers called the meeting to order at 10:13 AM. The minutes from the September 11, 2024, meeting were approved. Treasurer Ben Gardner reported a healthy balance and plans for future investments, including a new speaker system for virtual members and potential scholarships for mining students. The Treasurer's report was unanimously approved (see attached).

Dues will be sent out soon, and while we have a speaker for the next meeting, we still need additional speakers for the year. We are considering the Indiana County area for the next meeting; details will follow.

## **Technical Forum (10:20-10:53)**

### PACA Update from Megan Dennis:

PACA is monitoring the upcoming technical guidance on underground benching and anticipates several comments once it's published. We are also reviewing the EPA Echo database submitted by DEP due to discrepancies in timelines that may lead to misleading violations. Timely comments on regulatory changes are crucial, especially with deadlines approaching in early 2024. We also discussed OSHA's new heat injury prevention rule for worker in high temperatures.

#### PCA Update for Rachel Gleason:

Rachel provided updates on election member changes and discussed ongoing issues with REGGIE. The Pennsylvania Supreme Court recently reversed the Commonwealth Court's denial of intervention by nonprofits, allowing their appeals to proceed.

The OSM's ten-day notice rule now treats all violations equally and has removed the requirement for citizens to contact state regulatory authorities before reporting issues. It also allows multiple violations to be combined into a single notice and establishes timelines for state responses.

Several technical guidance documents related to water supply replacements and insurance requirements are also under review.

#### PA DEP Speed Program

The PA DEP Speed Program, launched last fall, streamlines permits for economic development by allowing the use of DEP-approved professionals for initial permit reviews. The DEP is required to make final decisions or identify issues within a specific timeframe. Currently, the program does not include mining, as DEP is still working with the PayBack System in that area.

To qualify as a DEP-approved professional, applicants must:

- Have at least five years of relevant permitting experience
- Hold all necessary professional licenses
- Have no felony convictions or license revocations in the last ten years
- Be accountable for costs if a review is inadequate
- Have not worked for the applicant in the last three years

Participation in the program has been limited.

#### Rise PA Grants

Updates on various environmental regulations and grant opportunities were provided, including Rise PA funding for decarbonization projects. Discussions included potential donations for scholarships or funds before year-end.

#### **DEP Offices Merging Workloads**

DEP members have mentioned that things are not going well. They have reached out to some other offices for expertise in an effort to expedite our NPDES permits in California. However, coordination can be challenging when team members are located so far apart. Additionally, staff numbers are significantly reduced. DEP members have mentioned that things are not going well. #### PAG 02 Update

Update is on the fact sheet on the elibrary, went into effect December 7 of this year. General standards for Stormwater discharges and an Annual Report to be submitted each year by December 7, which will be the anniversary of the general permits expiration date to provide information on the status of the project.

#### MSHA Silica Rule

The new compliance date is in April. If your measurements fall between 25 and 50, you could face an ongoing sampling challenge. The only way to reduce levels below this is through engineering controls. The NSSGA has also filed a lawsuit against MSHA regarding the silica rule, and this will move forward next year. Start sampling now to gather your data.

#### **DEP Update**

Sam Faith and Dave Thomas have highlighted that the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is focusing on payback and reducing the backlog, with strong support from upper management. The staff is effectively managing payback, our top priority, and working to minimize the backlog in the first quarter of next year. Recently, several incentives were issued for non-responsiveness to information requests. It's essential that all applications are complete; otherwise, they will be denied to avoid delaying our deadlines.
